To obtain a divorce in New Mexico, you or your spouse must have lived in New Mexico for the last six months. To begin a divorce, you must first file a petition and other papers in the district court in the county where you live or where your spouse lives. The divorce is not final until the judge signs the Final Decree of Dissolution of Marriage.

Types of divorce . Couples who can agree on the terms of their separation can file a joint petition requesting divorce in New Mexico. Those couples who are not able to reconcile their differences before filing a petition for divorce will need to appear in court to argue their case before a judge. This is known as a contested divorce. No fault divorce

If you want to file for divorce in New Mexico, either your spouse or you should have resided in the state for 6 months before the date of filing and must have a domicile in the state. Domicile is defined as: The individual is present in the state physically and also has his/her residence in the state.

The residency requirements for a divorce in New Mexico are as follows: Either party must reside in the state for at least six months preceding the date of the filing and have a home in the state. The petition may be filed in the county in which either spouse resides.
